

The Garden Club of Harvard Educational Grant Program

GENERAL

The Educational Grant Program is funded annually by the Garden Club of Harvard, MA, to promote an interest in horticulture and environmental education. The program is administered by a committee appointed by the President and chaired by the Vice President.

PURPOSE

To provide eligible candidates with funding for activities or studies deemed by the Committee to be of significant benefit to the applicant, the organization, and/or the greater community, in horticulture or environmental education.

LIMITS

Applications may be made for project funding in amounts ranging from \$50 to \$500 per year.

ELIGIBILITY

Any current resident of Harvard, MA; any full time employee of the town of Harvard, MA; or any designated representative of a town organization whose purpose will directly benefit residents of the town of Harvard, MA may apply for funding.

PROCEDURE

Application forms are available at the schools, the town hall, and the library. Only one grant will be awarded to any applicant/organization in any calendar year. New applications may be submitted in ensuing years.

DEADLINE

Applications must be received by May 15, for awards presented in June of the same year.

OBLIGATIONS

Grantees are to report (on a schedule determined for each project) to the Educational Grant Committee at key points of the project's progress. Grantees may be asked to make an oral presentation to interested members of the Garden Club of Harvard, MA.
