
A Nejiri Scaper!





Lifting heavy loads. Rule of 20%: Lift no more than 20 lbs., keep the load no more than 20 inches away from the body, NO load is the safest!
Use your knees and not your back when bending. Bend from the hips. Vary tasks and change positions. Don't work more than 20 minutes in the same position.

Keep the wrist straight in line with your forearm, thumps up, elbows partially bent. Avoid twisting. Use the right tools: sharpened; the handle should be adapted to your height. Use two hands, hold with a light grasp, and vary positions.

This contest is a project our club can do to encourage care for nature and the environment.


